# 3 Simple Rules

#### 1. Never make a pronoun possessive using an apostrophe

2. Always make a noun possessive using an apostrophe

3. Never use an apostrophe with a verb

#### 3 Common Mistakes

```
Right: Unit testing has its benefits.
Wrong: Unit testing has it's benefits.
```

Right: Carol's code is clean. Her code's style is precise. Wrong: Carols code is clean. Her codes style is precise.

Right: He runs that backup every day. Wrong: He run's that backup every day.

A **noun** is a specific person, place, thing or idea: Carol, France, house, radish, memory, Chipotle. A **verb** is an action taken by the subject. He *codes*. She *tests*. They *demonstrate*.

A **pronoun** is a generic, non-specific person or thing. These are the common pronouns: it, he, she, her, them, they.
